Works of art mingle with alabaster and rock crystal designs. Transcended by light, these pieces feature unique textures, patterns and colors that transform the gallery's spaces into vibrant scenes.

Interview with Caroline Leite

Nature Minérales features a limited series of alabaster lighting elements and slabs that the artist Caroline Leite used as a new medium for her illustrations. Using techniques of dry point or black chalk, Caroline Leite turns our iconic lighting designs such as INFINITY 8, LUNA, SUMATRA and BONNIE into original pieces of art.

The birds and flora she depicts in the style of antiquated engravings seem to emerge from the stone. Alain Ellouz encourages her to develop new techniques. Caroline begins by using a pencil to simply sketch directly onto the piece of alabaster. She follows the stone's patterns, letting herself be guided by its vibrant power. With great detail, she creates striking tree trunks, delicate branches and Birds of Paradise. Her work incorporates the volume of the alabaster piece, creating a three-dimensional, sculptural work of art. Her precise lines follow the edges, they splinter, with no backward movement possible. Her delicate lines become a lasting part of the material.

Natures minérales

Natures Minérales is a selection of Atelier Alain Ellouz lighting designs Caroline Leite used for her engravings. Using techniques of dry point or black chalk to engrave her illustrations of birds and flora onto the alabaster stone, Caroline questions our notions of time and the organic world. Her drawings 'tattoo' the stone, creating a duality between impermanence and the powerful presence of enduring mineral material.

Toiles d'albâtre

The Toiles d'albâtre (canvases of alabaster) series invites artists to use alabaster like a canvas. Instead of painting on the usual voiceless medium, the artist composes with this new material.

Alabaster's impressive graphics are formed deep in its mass from sedimentary rock, offering the artist a three-dimensional space, one where the stone's natural veins compel the emergence of unique, vibrant artwork.

Pixels d'albâtre

The Pixels d'albâtre (pixels of alabaster) series covers several works and installations by Alain Ellouz. They explore the difference in scale between an image and its object. As they seemingly emerge from the earth or fall from the sky, the pixel-like cubes evoke not only the immensity of space but also the ephemeral nature of the material.

Photographies

Finally, the last series includes a collection of photographic work featuring alabaster by Christel Martin. As a sensitive admirer of the stone, Christel creates a dialog between alabaster and human bodies or material. She explores still life, dancers and landscapes in her various series. Her photos erase the boundaries of two-dimensional images and light seems to emanate from the elements they capture.

Caroline Leite


VISUAL ARTIST

As a visual artist, Caroline Leite studied at the School of Fine Arts in Versailles. She is an illustrator, engraver, photographer and sculptor all at once. She pursues an artistic approach focused on the notions of imprint, legacy and remembrance. Her sculptures of concrete ruin, her photographs and her drawings of plant life and birds are like reminders of the past and of the fragile balance of our worlds. Each one of her pieces tells a story, almost like contemporary cave paintings. Caroline's work with alabaster is almost sculptural, incorporating the volume and vibrant power of each stone piece.









Interview with Caroline Leite

Christine Solaï VIDEO & PAINTER ARTIST

After studying at the School of Fine Arts in Grenoble, in the year 2000 Christine Solaï attended the Fresnoy (Studio national des arts contemporains) art center. She created her first choreographic production mixing video and live performance. She's passionate about live performance and collaborates with several theater and dance companies, alternating as a choreographer and scenographer. She pursues her film work, using both documentaries and performances to address questions of legacy and heritage among exiled population. She and Alain Ellouz collaborated for the first time as exhibition co-curators for Chevauchées sur fragments d'albâtre, for which she developed the tour. When Alain discovered her drawings of mountainscapes, he asked her to reproduce them on alabaster. Total surprise! Christine discovers a medium completely new to her, but already full of history. She plays with the stone's veinlike patterns as she illustrates, which gives this hiking enthusiast the same unique pleasure she gets from her mountain excursions.





Christel Martin PHOTOGRAPHER

As a photographic artist, Christel Martin has been photographing Atelier Alain Ellouz lighting designs for many years. In 2019, her fascination for the stone led her to create a series entitled Nature Vivante in collaboration with David Chambard. In these pieces, alabaster lighting elements are composed with the painter's canvases. This series is a nod to the still life genre, and a celebration of not only the vibrant power of alabaster but also that of nature's elements depticted in David Chambard's paintings.

Other alabaster-inspired series were to follow. Christel developed one where she invited dancers to move about in the presence of alabaster. The photographer captured a visible dialog between the dancers' silhouettes in motion and the stone. Yet another series from the artist features a white alabaster square as a focal point set against various landscapes.









Interview with Christel Martin

Bernard Pourchet DIGITAL ARTIST

After graduating from the Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs in Paris in 1991, Bernard began his journey as a graphic designer before deciding to devote himself exclusively to his artistic endeavors.

He expresses himself using the digital medium and a pictorial vocabulary borrowed from the graphic design world. Photography is one of the focal points of his explorations, since he extracts graphic material from that medium to compose his creations primarily intended for print. His works are like maps of imaginary worlds, inviting the eye to move about scanning the image's details.

Alain Ellouz invited Bernard Pourchet to compose his pieces by dialoguing with the materiality of the alabaster canvases the gallery's founder selected. The magic in these works emerges from a search for a tenuous balance between the graphic power of alabaster and printed images.


Alistair Danhieux CERAMIST

Since 2003, Alistair Danhieux has lived and worked in the French department of Nièvre in Saint-Amand-en-Puisaye, a well-known cradle of ceramists. It is in this town that he began his journey into the world of ceramics. Alistair works primarily with stoneware and porcelain, onto which he hand paints motifs using a blend of metallic oxides and enamel.

His pieces are exhibited throughout many galleries in France and some of them can even be found in the Cité de la céramique, a French national ceramics museum located in Sèvres. Alistair demonstrates his well-sharpened skill in this first artistic collaboration with the foundation. His artistry is guided by alabaster's veins, which offer the canvas upon which he creates.









Alain Ellouz

ENTREPRENEUR, ARTIST AND GALLERY OWNER

Creator of Atelier Alain Ellouz as well as of the foundation also named after him. Alain defines himself first and foremost as an artist from the outsider art movement. A passionate sculptor, Alain initially discovered alabaster in 1996. And that encounter marked a turning point in his life. In 2005, he modeled his new company around two passions: art and alabaster. Following a handful of collections created in partnership with his artistic director, Marion Biais-Sauvêtre, in 2021 he decided to further pursue endeavors in the art world. In March 2022, he inaugurated his foundation, and by the same token he prenented not only some of his most stately sculptures in the gardens surrounding the building, but also his Pixels d'albâtre, which showcase the work involved in extracting alabaster from quarries. That following October, Alain Ellouz launched his first exhibition entitled Chevauchées sur fragments d'albâtre. During the same month he created several pieces as part of his pixels d'albâtre series, and he also developed the innovative toiles d'albâtre concept in collaboration with two guest artists, Bernard Pourchet and Alistair Danhieux.







In 2005, Alain Ellouz founded a creative art workshop he named after himself. Devoted exclusively to alabaster, Atelier Alain Ellouz puts its unique know-how, innovative stone-protecting technology and clever lighting systems into creating bespoke projects such as exceptional luminaires, back-lit walls, furnishings, etc., all designed in the same pure tradition upheld by French luxury brands.

Eighteen years have gone by, and the workshop has become a leader in alabaster design, winning international acclaim for its standard of excellence while collaborating with major designers and luxury brands in France and abroad.
